

Board Nominations – Applications Requested

The Board of Directors for Yukon Quest International, Ltd. (YQIL) seeks applicants to serve on its Board of Directors.*

Three board members will be elected in May 2018 for 3-year terms.

Qualifications: To be considered for the board, applicants must be members in good standing of Yukon Quest International, Ltd. (YQIL) as of May 30, 2018 and able to travel to Canada without legal restrictions.

Commitment: Board members are expected to attend monthly board meetings in Fairbanks (teleconferencing is available) and to attend two joint meetings with the Yukon board (in Fairbanks in Spring, in Whitehorse in Fall; two days for each meeting, not including travel time). Board members should expect to dedicate a minimum of 10 hours per month to board meetings and other Yukon Quest business. Special events and other projects may take additional time.

Ballots will be mailed no later than May 9 to all members in good standing without an email address on record; all others will be emailed that same date. All candidates will be given the opportunity to address members at our annual meeting, Wednesday, May 30, 2018, 6pm at the La Quinta Inns and Suites. Ballots returned by email, mail, fax, or delivered in person to the YQIL office must be received by 3pm on Wednesday, May 30. Members may submit their ballot in person at the annual meeting. Election results will be announced at the end of the meeting.

The Nominating Committee will review all applications. Nominations will not be accepted during the Annual General Membership meeting and write-ins will not be accepted on the ballot.
