

Travel between Whitehorse and Fairbanks

There are no direct flights, and connections would most likely be either Vancouver or Seattle.

Directions between Whitehorse to Fairbanks

From Whitehorse- Travel north on the Alaska Highway through Haines Junction. At Haines Junction, you will turn right following signs to Fairbanks, Alaska. Just after Beaver Creek, you will go through American Customs. Starting at Gerstle River until about 6 miles East of Delta, watch closely for buffalo (bison) who are not shy about being on the road. From here continue along the highway until you reach Fairbanks.

Plan your rests, meals, and fuel ups on this trip! It will take a long time (approximately 12 hours or more) and there will not be many good opportunities to stop along the way so plan ahead! Many gas stations have limited hours – so check ahead and bring extra fuel for this 590 mile trip.



From Fairbanks- Travel south on the Alaska Highway through Delta Junction then Tok, cross the Canadian border at Beaver Creek, and continue on to Haines Junction. In Haines Junction, you keep on the Alaska Highway East to Whitehorse. (See precautions noted above.)

United States / Canada Border Crossing

A passport will be required for all travelers crossing the American/Canadian border. If you do not have a passport, please apply as early as possible.
